- Preparing technical reports for use by engineering, management or sales personnel
- Maintaining records of engineering department activities, including details of equipment maintenance and repairs.

Essential skills

- Good working knowledge and experience of working with marine electrical and electronic systems
- Knowledge of marine electronic systems such as Raymarine, Garmin and Simrad
- Ability to work with 12/24V DC and 240V AC systems
- Ability to work well within a team
